Letter of Encouragement

I want to encourage us as a church family to choose to connect deeply! Pastor Trey spoke recently about the season we're moving into as a church, a season of connecting deeply.

Connecting deeply with God, ourselves, each other, and our city! I want to encourage you whether you're a student or a parent and you haven't fully plugged into the Blaze Community. Now is the time!

To any students who feel hesitant about getting plugged in to community, we're here for you! Maybe you've never been to the Blaze before and are nervous about feeling left out. Maybe you're a student who's come to the Blaze before but you didn't feel super comfortable yet. I want to encourage you. Community is cultivated through hard work and consistency.

If you feel awkward or scared about coming . . . come anyway!

Jesus honors faithfulness. When I first started attending a young adults group in Austin, I didn't know anyone and felt really anxious and frustrated at first. But I knew Jesus wanted me to have community. I knew that His Word says

A man who isolates himself seeks his own desires; he rages against all wise judgment. Proverbs 18:1 (NKJV)

I decided I wanted to pursue community no matter the cost!

So I kept showing up, and each time I resolved that I would be the kind of friend I was looking for to the people around me! Then I found out that other young adults felt just as awkward as I did and they were so thankful that I pursued relationship with them. I now can testify that I have a core group of trusted saints that I call my friends.

Jesus blessed my faithfulness with a rich community. But it wasn't handed to me—it was cultivated by me partnering with the Kingdom Mission of connection.

Connect deeply, pursue community, do it afraid!

One of my favorite moments from a recent service was seeing one of our students, Gabe, begin to really come out of his shell.

Toward the end of the night, we were eating pizza after a spirit-filled night of connecting with our small groups. I heard a "shriek" from one of our leaders and looked toward the sound. One of our leaders must've made some kind of **hilarious** noise because the only thing that I saw after that was Gabe hunched over in laughter. One of those laughsso-hard-that-your-voice-just-"disappears" kind of laughs.

I watched in gratitude as I witnessed the joy of the Lord encounter a once intensely shy student. He even had to lean on the wall for the next few minutes because of how hard he was laughing.

That is the power of community. Parents, if you're on the fence about bringing your student to The Blaze, let me tell you that we were created for relationship. So no matter how quiet or "awkward" a student seems, everyone should be given the opportunity for community.

l urge you to get your kids plugged in! It's what being the Church means.

The #1 way we can "Keep the Fire Roaring" is by constant communion with Jesus. When we remember the price He paid to pursue each of us, we can't help but fall in love with Him.

I want to encourage parents to do communion regularly as a family. Remembering His body and His blood.


